We had arranged to meet with Juanita and Martinus there and of course, she is the famous organiser of the World Naked Bike Ride in Cape Town every March. It always coincides with the old Argus Bike Ride which is now called the Cape Town Cycle Tour. The World Naked Bike Ride will be on Saturday, 9th March and the Cape Town Cycle Tour will be on Sunday, 10th March, 2024. Juanita also has a group called Naturism South Africa which arranges camping

to supporting all naturist associations, naturist resorts and naturist guesthouses. We all agreed to do our utmost to bring all the naturist groups together to work for the good of naturism in the Western Cape and South Africa.
